 A Police Officer helps to prevent crime and disorder in the community you are based.



What would you do?

- Patrol towns, cities and rural areas
- Deal with anti-social behaviour and violent incidents
- Attend incidents like traffic accidents
- Arrest suspects, interview them and take statements
- Give evidence in court



What do you need?

- There are 3 <u>new</u> routes in
 - 1. Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship (PCDA). This route usually takes three years to complete and provides the opportunity to both learn and earn while working. You'll typically need a level 3 qualification (A-level or equivalent)
 - 2. Degree holder entry graduates with a degree in any subject can apply for a two-year work-based training programme, paid for by the force
 - 3. Pre-joining degree a self-funded, three-year academic degree in professional policing undertaken at a university or college before you join the police

What do you need?

 Useful subjects to study at GCSE and A-level include: Maths, English and Law but there are no set requirements

 For A-levels always check with universities regarding their preferences
