- You can become an Architect by either going to University to study for a degree or getting an apprenticeship



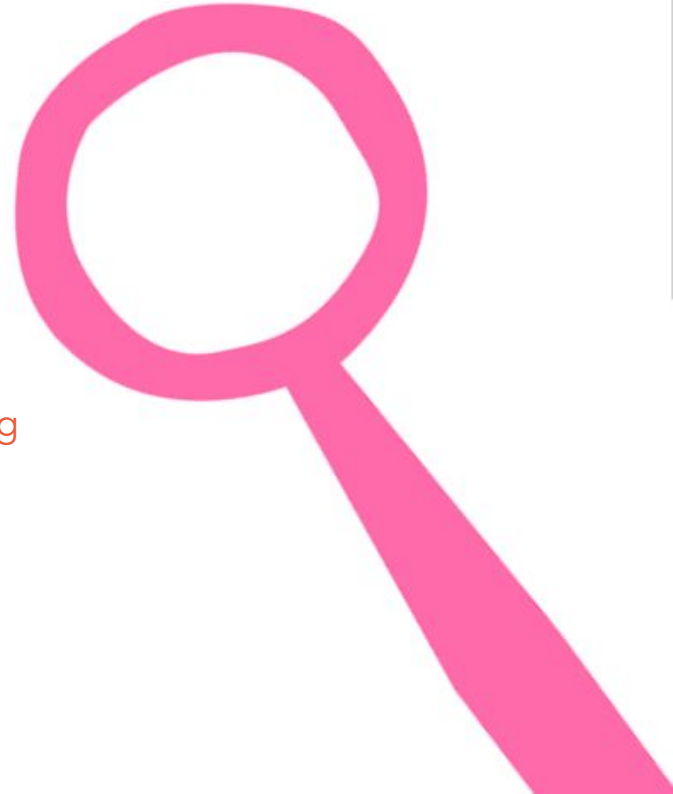
# What do you need?

## ● University - you will need

- A degree recognised by the Architects Registration Board (ARB)
- A year of practical work experience

## ● Entry Requirements - you will need

- 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C), or equivalent, including English, maths and science
- 2 to 3 A levels, or equivalent
- For A levels always check with universities regarding their preferences





# What do you need?

## ● For an apprenticeship:-

- You can get into this role through an architect degree apprenticeship.

## Entry requirements

- 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C) and A levels, or equivalent, for a higher or degree apprenticeship
