Primary Intake Days:

Our Primary Intake Days are two fun filled days for the children, spent with us here at Co-op Academy Swinton on **Thursday 27 June** and **Friday 28 June**.

During the two days children follow a typical timetable to give them an insight to our academy routine and what a typical day looks like. They'll have the opportunity to look around the school and learn all about our Co-op values, procedures and expectations and take part in a culinary challenge.

Please arrive at the academy by 8:20am on both days. All children will stay on the premises during lunchtime. Please ensure they have either money for snacks, a school meal or sandwiches. Children who receive free school meals will receive their entitlement as normal. Travel for your child to and from Co-op Academy Swinton must be organised by parents/carers.

Although our activities are planned to start at 8:30 we would love your child to join us for a welcome breakfast at 8am to kickstart their day.

Time: 8:30am-3:05pm (On Thursday 27th June your child must wear their full primary school uniform and on Friday 28th June your child must wear their primary school PE kit)

Lunches

All our food is cooked on the premises and many ingredients are sourced from local suppliers. We offer a wide selection of balanced and nutritious, hot and cold foods starting with breakfast through to break time and lunchtime services.

Free Breakfast Club: **7:30am-8:30am** Morning Break: **10:40am-10:55am** Lunch 1: **12:55pm-1:30pm** Lunch 2: **1:35pm-2:05pm**



Our lunches are served on a three-week rotating menu with multiple choices includ-

ing sandwiches, soups, pasta dishes, jacket potatoes and a variety of hot main courses, desserts and drinks. Students may also bring their own packed lunch and we have a large range of Halal foods available.

Our academy operates a 'Cashless Catering System' where each student is issued with a personal PIN number which they use to purchase any food or drink in school at breakfast, break and lunchtimes (food cannot be purchased in our canteens/food huts with cash).

This personal account for your child is linked to our online payment system, Scopay, which enables parents/carers to credit their account with money, ready for them to make purchases. Prior to joining our academy you will be given the access code and on your child's first day the PIN code is already associated with the account.

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Some handy hints and tips!

The move from primary to secondary school is an exciting time for children and marks a new phase in their lives. The move itself can be daunting but most children will manage this transition successfully. There may, however, be ups and downs but as a parent there are many things you can do to help your child through this transition period with careful and sensitive preparation.

We wanted to share some help and advice to assist during this time. Here are some excellent tips, taken from youth charity, Young Minds. You may want to use these as points of discussion with your child: Talk about starting secondary school with your child:

Talk about starting secondary school with your child

Chat about how they are feeling and how it will be different from primary - for instance bigger site, new people, changing teachers and rooms for subjects, more homework.

Reassure them that nerves about starting something new are normal, as is some sadness at leaving familiar things, and that these feelings usually subside.

But be careful not to impose your own worries. Focus on exciting opportunities too - new subjects, activities and friends. Celebrating the milestone of finishing primary school, and all the ways they have grown, can boost self-esteem and confidence.

Familiarise your child with their new school

Make sure you take advantage of Year 6 Transition Days. These are a great opportunity to meet teachers, other starters and find out about the school layout and day. Minimising unknowns for day one can reduce anxiety. Schools often provide extra familiarisation days for vulnerable children - a chance to meet the SENCO and support staff and look around in a quieter environment.

Prepare in advance

Try to get organised over the summer rather than leaving it to the last minute, which can be stressful for parent and child. A trip to buy uniform, get a haircut or choose new stationery is an opportunity to spend time together, chat and boost confidence too.

Secondary students often travel independently for the first time. Do some trial runs – with you, then perhaps solo or with a friend. Work out the first day plan. Your child may prefer to go with you to start, or to meet a friend on the way.

Help develop independence and organisation

Secondary school demands are greater, so preparation should help build their own skills and confidence. This will help them settle quicker. Don't do it all for them. Could they arrange to meet friends, do shopping errands (good lunchtime practice) or organise their bag for a day out? Be guided by what feels manageable for your child though. It's fine if they need more support than some others.

Once school starts, try developing independent organisation with post-it notes listing what's needed each day; boxes to store other books and worksheets; and an evening habit of checking their school planner and preparing uniform and bag.

Give it time - and keep some reassuring routines

Trusted old friends and habits are comforting, particularly in the exhausting early weeks, if a child doesn't know anyone, or if they are finding it hard to settle. Seeing primary classmates or enjoying familiar activities may be a welcome relief from the effort of starting a new school.

Too much change at once can feel overwhelming too. So while it's great if they throw themselves into everything, don't worry if they don't. They need to adjust and relax. So resist the urge to quiz them too heavily as well.
