Principal's Message



Dear Parents/Guardians

As we come to the end of this academic year I would like to thank you all for your support. Please do take time to read our newsletter celebrating this half term and our students. On the 11th and 12th June we recieved a visit from Ofsted. I have summarised the report for you below:

Ofsted Inspection - 11th and 12th June 2024 Overall Effectiveness - Good

- Quality of Education Good
- Behaviour and Attitude Good
- Personal Development Good

- Leadership and Management - Good

What does the school do well (summary):

- The school has improved the quality of education that pupils receive. Pupils appreciate the positive impact that the school has on their behaviour and on their learning. They value the high standards that the school expects of their academic achievement and conduct.

- Most pupils live up to these high expectations. Pupils, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), follow a broad and ambitious curriculum. They achieve well in a range of subjects.

- Pupils at the school are articulate and extremely polite. They interact well with staff and appreciate the support that they receive when they are experiencing difficulties or have any concerns. Most pupils' behaviour in classrooms and around the school is calm and orderly. Pupils told inspectors that the school's approach to improving positive behaviour helps everyone to learn well.

- Pupils are happy in school. Pupils benefit from the wide range of clubs and visits that are on offer. These include sewing, social action and reading clubs. There are also numerous sporting and musical enrichment activities. For example, pupils, including those who are disadvantaged, enjoy participating in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

- The school has set out the important knowledge that pupils should learn and when this content should be taught. Teachers are suitably equipped to deliver the curriculum well. Typically, teachers design learning that helps pupils, including those who are disadvantaged, to build a rich body of subject knowledge. The school uses assessment strategies well to check that pupils have secured the knowledge in the curriculum

- There have been noticeable improvements in the quality of support for pupils with SEND. Pupils' needs are identified appropriately and in a timely manner. Staff use information about pupils' SEND effectively. Staff make suitable adjustments to help these pupils to learn well.

- The school places a high importance on reading. For example, the school assesses the reading skills of pupils in all year groups so that those who need additional help are identified accurately. These pupils receive bespoke support to become confident, fluent readers. Many of these pupils make rapid progress. - Staff said that their workload is manageable and that they feel well supported by the school.

Have a safe and healthy summer break. I look forward to welcoming back our students on Wed 4th Sept at 8:25am.

Important information for Parents, changes as of 19th August 2024 to the issue of Penalty Notices for Non-School attendance.

Dear Parent,

The Education (Penalty Notices) (ENGLAND) (AMENDMENT) Regulations 2024 No. 210

New Legislation comes into force on 19th August 2024 regarding the issuing of penalty notices relating to none school attendance. The following changes will come into force for penalty notice fines issued after 19th August 2024.

New National Threshold

There will be a single National Threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England and Wales of 10 sessions of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of any type of unauthorised absence.

From 19th August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £160 discounted to £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.

If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160 with no discount given for early repayment.

- 1. The **first time** a penalty notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid discounted to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- 2. The **second time** a penalty notice is issued for unauthorised absence (within 3 years) the amount will be £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.

Any term time holidays that are taken after the start of the 2024/25 academic year will be treated under the new Legislation as the new rules apply to any offences committed from 19 August 2024, regardless of when the holiday is booked.

Should a **third absence** be taken within the three-year period, a parent may be summonsed to the Magistrates Court for knowingly failing to secure good attendance at school (Section 444 (1A) of Education Act 1996).
